On the last day of Bible Quest before Spring break and Easter, the children came with lots of energy and lots of emotions. We could feel it as Lindy and I gathered the children in the hallway at North Woods School. We could see it in the faces of the teachers. We experienced it as we arrived at Trinity and went about our routine of prayer, snack, Bible story and activity. Bible Quest often feels like organized chaos and this day was no exception.

We had a lot to cover in our Bible story time. Pr. Erika had suggested they draw the bulletin covers for Easter Sunday which meant that we would walk through the entirety of Holy Week, from Palm Sunday to Good Friday, in order to get to Easter. We started with Palm Sunday in the entry way, down the stairs from the sanctuary, and physically walked up the stairs and into the sanctuary. We walked towards the

cross as we talked about each day of Holy Week. Palm Sunday – parade and celebration. Monday – Jesus and the disciples in Jerusalem. Tuesday – Jesus teaching in the temple. Wednesday – Jesus visiting with friends and praying, Thursday - at the altar, around the table for the Last Supper. Friday – at the cross, Jesus' death. Before we arrived at the altar, I wasn't sure how much they were able to take in. It was a lot and they were already full of energy and emotions. But when I looked at their faces and heard their questions as we stood around the Lord's Table, I knew they got it. But the story wasn't over, we had to get to the resurrection. As they sat in the church pews, we continued with the resurrection story. And the questions, oh the questions. They got it.

They got the complexity of it all. They got the emotional roller coaster of it all. They got the excitement and joy of Palm Sunday, the ups and downs of the week, the tragedy of Good Friday, the grief and sorrow that followed, and the joy and hope of resurrection. They got it because they live it. They live those big feelings. Just like we do. All of the feelings and experiences of Holy Week and Easter exemplify our own lives. Jesus and his followers experienced what we experience. God experienced what we experience.

After I explained the project of drawing and coloring pictures for the Easter Sunday bulletin covers, they reverted to talking about the Easter bunny and I wondered if that's what would be featured on our bulletin covers. After a little encouragement to stick to the story of Jesus for their drawings, they went to work. As the children worked on their pictures, the adults got the privilege of walking around to the different tables, sitting with them, eavesdropping on their conversations, and participating in conversations. What a treat!

After the children left, several of us adults stood looking through their pictures. We were blown away. Amidst the grief, the sadness and the complexity of this world, there is hope. There is hope in the resurrection. There is hope in our children. There is hope in Jesus. It's right there in those pictures.

May we all live in that hope.

Mental Health & Wellness Team -- ANGER

BIG FEELINGS are here in Trinity. We are experiencing a variety of unwanted BIG FEELINGS since learning of the return of Pastor Erika's cancer and her need for disability during many weeks of treatment. We have our own burdens and struggles in addition. Most of these feelings are easily recognized, if not easily managed. Let's focus on one that can be difficult for "good" Christians even in the best of times: ANGER. Is it OK for me to get angry? Can I be angry with God? What about "righteous anger"?

First, let's identify anger as a feeling that occurs naturally. It is a signal that something needs attention and probably action, just as pain is a signal that alerts us to a physical problem. Although we don't usually welcome it, anger can be viewed as a gift. The key is how we react to it.

If we can stop, count to 10 or 1,000,000, and reflect, we are more likely to identify the real source of our anger and an appropriate response. Anger is often a secondary response to fear after a perceived threat. It could be fear of loss of control of any kind, loss of pride, loss of the comfortably familiar. In interpersonal relations, it is helpful to sort out what may be someone's intended insult, what may be someone's negative emotions dumped on you, and what may be a valid, if painful, criticism. Responses then can be appropriate, ranging from assertively setting boundaries, to gentle feedback or generosity, to changing your own behavior.

Massive losses and injustices give rise to major anger. Yes, we can express our anger toward God as the writer of Psalms often did. We can stomp our feet and grieve. Appropriate and often necessary. But the secret power of anger is the energy it generates. With that energy and thoughtful evaluation of positive actions within our area of influence, we can begin to change the world, one small step at a time. Let's put our anger to work!

Discussion on an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) was tabled.


Council approved the dispersal of campership funds equally and proportionally among campers.

Prayers circles are a part of the day, one on Valentine's Day even had a bit of a "heart shape" that several of the children noticed. Each is encouraged to pray for someone or something, silently or aloud.

After a long day at school, there is always extra energy to be used up...especially on days when there may not be enough recess. Singing action songs with lots of body movement like Father Abraham *(above)* and racing across the parking lot, screaming as loud as possible *(right)* are just two productive ways.









And there is always a bible story, ending this March with the story of Jesus and his journey to the cross. Beginning in the entryway, each waving a palm while learning about the ride through the streets on the back of a donkey, Dn. Kari lead the procession. The group then continued up the stairs to the sanctuary and there they learned about the trials of the week to Good Friday, ending at the altar and the cross.

After a week of spring break, Bible Quest will resume for three final weeks, starting April 10.
