


Time to think about LUTEFISK!

This is why I am so glad that we are focusing on Hope this year. In the Introduction to the *Sparking Hope Resource Booklet* for the Northeastern Minnesota Synod, Bishop Amy Odgren defines hope in these words:

Biblical hope is a confident expectation in the promises of God, grounded in God's character And faithfulness. Unlike a wish or vague desire, it is anchored in the certainty that God fulfills what God proclaims. As it is written, "Faith is the assurance of what we hope for and the certainty of what we do not see." (Hebrews 11:1)

This past weekend, I experienced great hope as Suzie Holter and I attended our Synod's All Youth Gathering, *United in Hope*, with 14 of our 7 – 12 grade youth. We joined about 300 others on Saturday and Sunday for a wonderful overnight led by high school youth. The focus was on mental health and creating a brave space of hope and healing. The guest speaker was Joe Davis, and he provided us with fantastic hope-filled messages. We experienced wonderful worship and workshops, heard incredibly brave youth share their faith stories, sang together, played together,



laughed together, had meaningful conversations, and made new friends. Thank you to Jesse and April Glass for helping us get there and back.

As we enter into the season of Advent, let us continue to focus on hope and insist on it even in our fear.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13 (NRSVue)





Parsonage Update -

During October the crew upgraded the two decks in several steps:

- Cody Bixby, Dale Bixby, Roger Lindbeck, and Peter Stone removed the old flooring.
- Nick Nicklow, Peter Stone, and Leo Wilenius leveled the decks, added concrete supports, and hand-placed about 5 cubic yards of soil (including a plastic barrier) against the
 - foundation under the decks to direct surface water away from the foundation.
- Dale Horihan, Jim Mueller, Peter Stone, Bill Tibbets, and Gary Whitenack installed a moisture barrier flashing over the deck joists and laid new decking.





This was difficult, strenuous, volunteer work over four days between October 6 and October 23. Much appreciation for these volunteers and all their hard work. Please take a moment to acknowledge this effort and thank these volunteer crew members.


