What do you fear? INSISTING ON HOPE THIS ADVENT

Advent may seem like it's a long way off, but here we are in the middle of Autumn, and the liturgical season of Advent begins at the end of November. Both Advent and Autumn are favorites of mine because I always feel the invitation, the pull, to slow down and listen and go deeper in my spiritual life. Perhaps it's the contemplative in me or the very introverted part of me that appreciates this summons to slow down, but I truly appreciate the reminder.

November begins with All Saints Day, and we will celebrate All Saints Sunday on November 2. In the New Testament, the word saints is used to describe the entire membership of the Christian church, living and dead. All Saint's Day is a day when we remember, honor, and celebrate the lives of saints. Saints of God who have gone before us, saints of God still among us, and saints of God still yet to come. It's a beautiful time to remember that we are part of a great cloud of witnesses.

We end November with the first Sunday in Advent on November 30. This year we will be using a worship series from *A Sanctified Art* with the theme "What do you fear? Insisting on hope this Advent." We will follow this series through Epiphany. Here's an excerpt about this series from their website:

Luke's Gospel begins the story of Jesus with this opening line: "In the time of Herod..." This detail may seem minor to modern readers; however, it reveals layers of information about the fearful world Jesus entered, one filled with rampant oppression, economic disparity, uncertainty, and instability. A world not so unlike our own. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, we hear the whispers of angels delivering a surprising message: "Do not fear." When Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the magi are each called into God's redemptive story, they do not deny their fears-- they move through them. They ask questions, hold fast to courage, trust in good news, and say, "Here I am, Lord." When we find ourselves in fearful times, can we acknowledge our fears while also insisting on hope?

This Advent series takes seriously the angels' message and trusts that Christ's birth truly is good news of great joy for all people. ... As you journey through this season, may your hope become gritty and resilient. May you remember: hope that trembles is still hope. This season, let us insist on hope and trust that good news is greater than fear.

May we insist on hope as we continue on this journey together.



Caring for the Whole Self in 2026: A Year of Wellness Together

As we look ahead to 2026, your Mental Health and Wellness Team invites our church community to join us in a yearlong focus on whole-person wellness. We believe that God created us as beautifully complex beings — body, mind, and spirit — and that caring for each part of ourselves is an important act of faith and stewardship.

Throughout the year, we'll explore four pillars of health that together form the foundation of our overall well-being: Physical, Intellectual, Spiritual, and Emotional. Each quarter, we'll focus on one of these pillars through newsletter articles, a Temple Talk during worship, and an optional forum for learning and conversation.

Our Four Pillars of Health:

- Physical Health Caring for the body God gave us through movement, exercise, nourishing food, rest, sleep, and responsible use of medicine. We'll also explore topics like healthy boundaries, physical touch, and consent.
- Intellectual Health Nurturing our minds through curiosity, learning, creativity, and connection. This might include reading, puzzles, new experiences, meaningful conversations, and even laughter as a form of renewal.
- Spiritual Health Deepening our relationship with God through prayer, worship, service, community, meditation, energy work, Bible study, and personal devotions.
- *Emotional Health* Honoring the full range of human emotion, recognizing that our feelings are temporary but meaningful, and learning to care for ourselves and one another through grief, joy, and everything in between.

Our hope is that 2026 will be a year where we grow together in understanding how faith and wellness intertwine — caring for the whole self as a reflection of God's love and grace.

Worship Assistants and Readers Needed

We need your help as a Worship Assistant or Reader for our Sunday services. Never done it before? We will be happy to provide training for you. There is a table as you walk into the Fellowship Hall with sign-up sheets for two Ministry Opportunities.

- 1. To be a Worship Assistant a copy of the prayers will be emailed to you; and there will be a copy in the office on Sunday.
- 2. To be a Reader a copy of the readings will be emailed and a copy will be available in the office on Sunday.

Communion Servers Needed

There is also a need for Communion Servers. Again, if you have never done it before, we will to provide training for you. The table in the Fellowship Hall also has a sign-up sheet for a third Ministry Opportunity.

- 1. You can sign up to serve communion. The first Sunday of the month, communion is served at the rail so Deacon Kari and a Worship Assistant is all that is needed; second thru fourth Sundays two additional people are needed.
- 2. You can sign up to prepare the communion elements. You may set up the communion trays Tuesday Thursday during office hours. The wafer are prepared on Sunday morning. Everything then needs to be placed on the altar for worship.
- 3. You can sign up to clean the communion trays and other items after worship on Sunday.
- 4. Or you can sign up for all three steps!


