*As we prepare for Pentecost, how has the Holy Spirit lit a fire in you in/through your star word? What new thing has it inspired you to do?*


**What role is Trinity Lutheran being called to play in walking alongside immigrants and refugees?**

Hello everyone! This month I am going to give a little update for my article.

- 1) I have 10 sessions (as of April 28) of chemo left. My chemo sessions are on Thursdays in Virginia. Three to four weeks after chemo I will be having a double mastectomy.
- 2) I have no immune system at all right now! So I am trying to stay away from large group settings or if I am in a large group, I am keeping my mask on. I also doing limited pastoral care visits right now because of what germs I am have and what I may pick up from you!
- 3) I have a hot head! I am not covering my lack of hair because it is hot to wear a wig, scarf or hat and the sanctuary here in church is a very warm space for pastors/deacons!
- 4) There are a lot of downsides to chemotherapy and the steroids that come with it; some are not what you want to read in a newsletter! But I do want to share with you a couple so that you know why I am doing what I am doing. One of the side effects is swelling. I am not able to wear my collar shirts, some dress shoes, and even my alb is uncomfortable right now because of the effects of the drugs I am on. So, I will wear what I need to wear in this uncomfortable time. Thank you for your courtesy.
- 5) Thank you! Thank you all for your continued support, prayers, cards and gifts. I know you all were/are thinking of me and I thank you for that support.
- 6) What about help? I know that many of you have asked what you can do to help out. I thank you for your generosity. I have been holding off on asking for or accepting help at this time because I can still do many things. But when I am home healing from surgery, I will be more than happy to receive your help of meals and possibly other things! So this summer I will welcome your help!
- 7) I am so thankful that we have Dn. Kari. She has shouldered a huge load these last few months, especially when it was Lent. She took over and has led Bible Quest and Confirmation. She has done the pastor's role as well as her own job. I am grateful for everything she has done. I am glad you all have gotten to know her.
- 8) Keep moving forward! This is my motto. Every week forward is closer to my goal of being done with treatment and surgery and to finding a new normal. I know the Lord travels with me on this road. Thank you for helping me keep the faith and moving forward each week.

### ***Deacon Kari***

In these days of Easter, I keep thinking about one of my favorite stories in scripture. The story of Jesus walking with two of his disciples on the road to Emmaus. After Jesus' death and resurrection, the disciples were walking the seven miles from Jerusalem to Emmaus and talking about all that had just happened. I imagine they were experiencing quite a few emotions, including sadness and confusion. As they were walking, Jesus joined them and talked with them, and interpreted the things in scripture about himself. But the disciples did not recognize Jesus. As they approached Emmaus, the disciples invited Jesus to stay with them (still not knowing who he was). When they sat at the table with him, Jesus took bread and broke it and gave it to them. It was then that their eyes were opened and they recognized Jesus. Their eyes were opened and Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of the bread. It was then that they realized that their hearts had been burning all along the journey with Jesus as they made their way to Emmaus.

We have an opportunity in May to join others on a journey of congregational discernment using the Emmaus: Congregational Discernment Guide from Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS). We will gather after worship and coffee for a three-week forum where we will learn about asylum and refugee resettlement processes and discern what roles we, as a congregation, are open to and called to fulfill. We will discern how we can walk alongside immigrants and refugees. How we are being called as disciples of Christ to accompany others, listen to their stories, break bread together, and share our love.

The forums will be on May 8, 15, and 22. I am looking forward to walking, talking, breaking bread, and learning with you on the road with Jesus. May our eyes be opened and our hearts burning.

We celebrate her return and continue to pray for a complete recovery. She still has a piece of road to travel in this regard. I would like to thank Deacon Kari for stepping up to help cover Pastor’s absence, as well as all the members who stepped up to cover all the bases.

Easter is the zenith of positivity in the church year and we should soak it in as much as possible. So, I leave you with the words of the American songwriter Johnny Mercer.




