

Council Meeting Minutes (Unapproved)
December 12, 2021

Present: Jody Bixby, Bill Conger, Mike Enzmann, Pr. Erika Foss, Julie Horihan, Dn. Kari Olson, Crystal Phillips.
Also present was Sue Carstens-bookkeeper/treasurer.

Absent: Lynn Polich

Meeting called to order by President Bill Conger at 11:15 a.m.

Opening Devotional and Prayer: led by Bill Conger

Approval of Agenda: Motion by Jody Bixby to add New Business: Snowplowing to the agenda. Seconded by Bruce Garbisch. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report/Approval of Minutes: Motion by Bruce Garbisch to approve the Council Meeting Minutes from Monday, Nov. 15, 2021. Seconded by Mike Enzmann. Motion carried. Julie Horihan will make a three-ring binder to contain Approved Council Meeting Minutes to be housed in the church office. Julie will ask Beth Sprouls to keep electronic copies in the office as well.

Treasurer's Report: Sue Carstens walked through the financial report. Motion by Julie Horihan to approve the report. Seconded by Crystal Phillips. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Dn. Kari Olson began at Trinity on Monday, Dec. 5, 2021, as half-time Congregational Care Minister and has been getting settled into her office. Pr. Erika is preparing to call home-bound Trinity members in the next couple weeks. Pr. Erika will be on vacation Dec. 25-31. Dn. Kari will preach on Jan. 2, 2022.

President's Report: Bill Conger thanked all the volunteers who decorated the sanctuary and put together the manger scene outside.

Ministry Team Reports:

Building and Grounds: Bill Conger will ask custodian Jody to replace burned out light bulbs outside the building and to change the furnace filters.

Welcoming and Caring: This team will send out Christmas cards to shut-ins.

Social Outreach: This team needs a new leader for the monthly Community Meal. Julie Horihan will call a meeting in early January of the volunteers involved in the meal to-date to discuss how to proceed.

OLD BUSINESS

- 1) **Covid:** The Council reviewed our Covid-19 guidelines. The local and state data indicates that Covid-19 is still a very active and dangerous threat to vulnerable people. We also recognize that Christmas is a precious time in our church and is made special by participating in joyous as well as reflective worship.
 - a. Motion by Julie Horihan to let worshipers sing while wearing a mask, use fewer verses in hymns to minimize the amount of singing, and provide the option of continuous communion in front of the altar while retaining individual communion packets for those who are more comfortable with that option. Seconded by Jody Bixby. Motion carried.
 - b. Bill Conger will update and post the safety statement to reflect current Covid statistics and changes to our guidelines.
 - c. Bill Conger will talk to Bailey Conger on the Welcoming and Caring Committee to see if that team can send thank-you cards to our local health care workers.
- 2) **Funeral Fees:** Pr Erika proposed a Funeral Policy for Trinity Lutheran, consisting of guidelines and fees. Mike Enzmann made a motion to adopt the Funeral Policy as written. Seconded by Bruce Garbisch. Motion carried. The Funeral Policy can be found in the office.
- 3) **Congregational Questionnaire:** Jody Bixby and committee will meet in the new year to develop a questionnaire to gain feedback on congregational wants and needs.
- 4) **Constitution updates:** Bruce Garbisch researched if past motions in council meetings to change language in Trinity's constitution were acted on. He found three cases that need addressing.
 - a. Nov. 17, 2019 minutes to establish a Creation Care Team showed only the motion and second. The minutes did not reflect a vote and motion carried.
 - b. Feb. 18, 2020 minutes to establish an HR Team shows only the motion and second. The minutes did not reflect a vote and motion carried.
 - c. June 26, 2019 minutes to change the definition of a quorum reflected that "The new definition was 30 percent of the average worship attendance for the *current* year." A hand-written note from Council President Jim Aune dated June 19, 2019, said "The new definition was 30 percent of the average worship attendance for the *prior* year." Using the prior year's attendance is easier to calculate and, therefore, a better measure to use.

- i. Bruce Garbisch made a motion to correct the minutes from the June 26, 2019 Council meeting to be: “Via a continuing resolution, The TLC council approved redefining a quorum at congregational meetings to consist of a number equal to 30 percent of the average attendance, rounded off to the nearest whole integer, at Sunday services in the year *prior* to that in which the meeting is being held. That calculation shall be made prior to the start of the first congregational meeting of the current year in question.” Seconded by Pr Erika. Motion carried.
- ii. Jody Bixby made a motion to correct the minutes from the Nov. 17, 2019 and Feb. 18, 2020 Council meetings to reflect discussion and motion carried to establish a Creation Care Team and to establish an HR Team.
- iii. Julie Horihan will amend the original minutes from these three meetings to reflect these changes, who made the changes and mark the original minutes as “Amended.”
- iv. Bruce Garbisch will talk to Beth Sprouls to add these three Continuing Resolutions to the Trinity Constitution.
- v. Julie Horihan will inform synod of the quorum definition change to the Trinity Constitution. (Establishing the HR and Creation Care Teams do not need to go to the synod.)

5) Boy Scouts of America (BSA):

- a. Bill Conger contacted Rock Gilson and learned that they have no current participants in BSA and, as a result, are not using our facility at this time.
- b. Bill Conger shared the packet of information Trinity received from the BSA concerning voting on its proposed chapter 11 plan of reorganization and whether our congregation wishes to opt out of the treatment provided for “Charter Organizations” (those who support a BSA chapter).
- c. Motion made by Mike Enzmann to reject the Plan and to opt out of the third-party release. Seconded by Crystal Phillips. Motion carried. This is the stance by the United Methodist Church also. The intent of the Methodist advice is to vote against the plan as it provides inadequate compensation for the victims and it provides inadequate protection for the churches who chartered BSA chapters.

6) Deacon vote in Council meetings: Trinity’s COnstitution does not address a Deacon on Council. Bruce Garbisch discussed this topic with Rev. Rollie Bockbrader, assistant to the synod bishop, who stated that whether Dn. Kari Olson should be a voting member of Council requires a congregational vote. This topic requires a 30-day notice to the congregation prior to the meeting. Council will add this topic to a future congregational meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

1) Assign Council Member to each Ministry Team: This was tabled for a future meeting.

2) Snowplowing issues: Council discussed issues with the snowplowing service (e.g., pushing the snow onto the sidewalk and/or others’ property). Bill Conger will discuss these issues with Tom Burriss, who does the snowplowing.

Announcements:

- 1) Dn. Kari Olson will be installed on Sunday, Jan 16, 2022. Dn. Brenda Tibbetts will preside as a representative of the synod.
- 2) The next Quarterly Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, Jan. 16, 2022 following worship.

Next council meeting is Thursday, Jan. 13, 2022 in the church library.

Meeting adjourned at 1:30 p.m.

Let's do our best to make 2022 as good as we possibly can. We can do this with an upbeat attitude, the support of our Trinity family and the help of God.


